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82.10 TEMPORARY ADVERTISING SIGNS

That temporary signs be permitted subject to the following conditions:

- 1) The period of display must not exceed three months.
- 2) The size to be no greater than 1.5 square metres.
- 3) Each site to be specifically approved by the Council's Planning Committee who shall give consideration to traffic safety.
- 4) Each sign is subject to a \$50.00 fee (incl. GST).

82.11 SANDWICH BOARDS

Source: Planning and Regulatory Services Committee 8/5/03

The display of sandwich board type advertising signs on the edge of Council owned footpaths or road reserve is subject to the following controls:

1. One sign may be placed on public land outside the commercial premises to which the sign relates within the urban zone and shall only advertise services or products available

from the business to which they relate.

2. Signs and/or merchandise may only be placed to the outside extremities of footpaths, and on one side only.
3. No more than 1.5 metres of the footpath may be obstructed.
4. No sign shall be wider than 1.2 metres or 1 metre in height.
5. There will be no charge for sandwich board type signs, up to a maximum of two, located on privately owned land.
6. No person shall display any advertising material on a vehicle whether stationary or moving on a road, where that vehicle is being used primarily for the purpose of exhibiting advertising material thereon.

82.12 Election Signs

Source: Council, 26/1/05

That election signs be permitted activities under the Electoral Amendment Act 2004 and subject to the following conditions:

1. That one fee of \$200 (inclusive of GST) be paid per registered party per election.
2. That each registered party is restricted to a maximum of 12 signs in the district, to include a maximum

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- of four per ward (Seddon, Westport, Inangahua)
3. That the location of every sign shall be subject to landowner, occupier, and Council approval, and that landowner/occupier approval shall be given in writing on the standard "affected persons consent form".
 4. That any sign that will be visible from the State Highway must also have the written approval of Transit New Zealand before approval will be given by Council.
 5. No sign shall be erected as to restrict or obstruct the visibility of traffic entering or exiting from any adjacent property.
 6. If any sign is found to be in non-compliance with the Regulations, the applicant shall receive one written warning. Failure to take any action specified in the warning will result in the service of an abatement notice by Council staff.
 7. Any costs associated with enforcement, monitoring, storage and recovery of signs shall be borne by the applicant.
